Thank you for helping us keep our cemetery a safe place for our mowers and a place of beauty for all.

And thanks to our faithful mowing crews. They keep our parish campus looking so nice. No easy task especially in the last weeks when we have felt the full effects of summer heat.

Life as Sacred Journey

The Smith family had just moved into its new house. After school, little Emily came home from her first day. "How was school?" asked her mom. "It was great, mom," responded Emily with a big smile. "But I have a question. We're supposed to say where our home is and we've lived in so many places. I just don't know what to put down." This was a question that the mom asked herself sometimes. She felt sort of rootless since they moved about every three years. So she turned the question back to Emily. "Well, Em, where do you feel most at home?" Emily didn't answer right away. You could tell she was really thinking about it. "Mom, I feel at home when I'm with you. Can I put that down?"

This Sunday's gospel has Jesus telling his followers about where he feels at home. We read the following line, which many remember. "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head."

The point is this. For him location is not important. Rather he goes wherever he is needed. Jesus wants us to know that he was always available. He's not tied to a place. He's not about creating cities or monuments or sacred places. A place is sacred when it is occupied by Jesus or where what Jesus advocates is happening. One of the best lines in our tradition is this. "Where charity and love abound, there God is found."

The holy places in your life are wherever you experienced God's love. That's why our homes are among the holiest places on earth. Or anywhere love abounds.
