Life as Sacred Journey

Luke's Gospel is sometimes called "the gospel for everyone." People were invited to be a part of God's kingdom simply because they were human beings, loved by God. No one "got it" just because of family connections or nationality. Jesus was a Jew, and one of the greatest challenges of the early church was to be open to new members who were not Jews.

The key passage in this gospel is that people will come from all directions and all kinds of personal history to enter the kingdom. Once "inside" they will be invited to "recline at table." Eating with others at the same table is a powerful statement of solidarity and oneness. Being invited to the family table was always intended as far more than just eating.

Hospitality is one of the great virtues of the Christian family. We need reminders of the importance of the family meal. Some of the deepest family memories will be created between the first bite and the dessert. Families also do well to think of inviting the lonely, the elderly or anyone who by circumstances usually eats alone.

In a sense, the family meal is the family Eucharist. This is what Jesus wanted: all of us sitting around one great table and enjoying each other. Life in God's kingdom is symbolized by the gathering of all people at one hugh banquet. Local foods from around the world will be served. The banquet guests will be representative of all cultures, regions, languages and backgrounds. Everyone is one around this table because they are all loved by God.

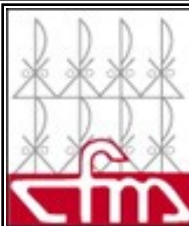
