Dear friends,

Preparations begins today for our rummage sale next Friday and Saturday. Elsewhere in the bulletin you will find particular information about when to bring your items, etc. I make a special plea for help this week. Our rummage sale has gotten rather big these past few years and has developed a reputation for being a quality rummage sale. All that takes lots of effort. So, if you have a little time or a lot, come by and share it with us this week. Many hands make the work go faster and more enjoyable for all.



The work on turning the convent into the new rectory is continuing. Special thanks to Jim and Vernie Gries and Billy Luigs for removing the old radiators last week. We have some items from the convent that we are offering to folks in the parish. There are a couple of desks, some cabinets and a twin size bed and mattress. There are also some bathroom sink/cabinets that are very nice as well. If you would like any of these items, come and check them out, make us an offer. If no one expresses an interest in them, we'll put them with the rummage sale.



This week we begin the first week of our new fiscal year. In trying to be good stewards of the resources you have entrusted to us, our finance commission has worked diligently to limit the increase in our parish budget to 2%. That's quite an achievement when you have to deal with increased costs for health insurance as well as pension costs, while at the same time trying to give a pay raise to our employees. In order to do all this, we need to increase our average collections by 2% as well. I think this is a manageable challenge for us.

This means that our collections will need to average \$17,900 each week—an increase of \$400 per week. If everyone in the parish could increase their collection offerings by \$1 a week we would be able to meet this increase. As always we put our financial needs into your hands. Your love for our parish has seen us through in the past and gives us confidence that we will meet this challenge as well.

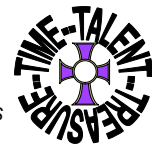
